Ephesians 1:5 Having **PREDESTINATED** us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will,

PREDESTINATION

4309. proorizo, pro-or-id'-zo; from G4253 and G3724; to limit in advance, i.e. (fig.) predetermine:--determine before, ordain, predestinate.

4253. pro, pro; a prim. prep.; "fore", i.e. in front of, prior (fig. superior) to:--above, ago, before, or ever. In comp. it retains the same significations.

3724. horizo, hor-id'-zo; from G3725; to mark out or bound ("horizon"), i.e. (fig.) to appoint, decree, specify:--declare, determine, limit, ordain.

3725. horion, hor'-ee-on; neut. of a der. of an appar. prim. horos (a bound or limit); a boundary-line, i.e. (by impl.) a frontier (region):--border, coast.
