HOLY

40. hagnos, hag'-ee-os; from hagos (an awful thing) [comp. G53, H2282]; sacred (phys. pure, mor. blameless or religious, cer. consecrated):--(most) holy (one, thing), saint.

53. hagnos, hag-nos'; from the same as G40; prop. clean, i.e. (fig.) innocent, modest, perfect:--chaste, clean, pure.

2282. chag, khag; or chag, khawg; from H2287; a festival, or a victim therefor:--(solemn) feast (day), sacrifice, solemnity.

2287. chagag, khaw-gag'; a prim. root [comp. H2283, H2328; prop. to move in a circle, i.e. (spec.) to march in a sacred procession, to observe a festival; by impl. to be giddy:--celebrate, dance, (keep, hold) a (solemn) feast (holiday), reel to and fro.

2283. chaga', khaw-gaw'; from an unused root mean. to revolve [comp. H2287]; prop. vertigo, i.e. (fig.) fear:--terror.

2328. chuwg, khoog; a prim. root [comp. H2287]; to describe a circle:--compass.

SPIRIT

4151. pneuma, pnyoo'-mah; from G4154; a current of air, i.e. breath (blast) or a breeze; by anal. or fig. a spirit, i.e. (human) the rational soul, (by impl.) vital principle, mental disposition, etc., or (superhuman) an angel, daemon, or (divine) God, Christ's spirit, the Holy Spirit:--ghost, life, spirit (-ual, -ually), mind. Comp. G5590.

5590. psuche, psoo'-khay'; from G5594; breath, i.e. (by impl.) spirit, abstr. or concr. (the animal sentient principle only; thus distinguished on the one hand from **G4151, which is the rational and immortal soul**; and on the other from G2222, which is mere vitality, even of plants: these terms thus exactly correspond respectively to the Heb. H5315, H7307 and H2416):--heart (+ -ily), life, mind, soul, + us, + you.

4154. pneo, pneh'-o; a prim. word; to breathe hard, i.e. breeze:--blow. Comp. G5594.

5594. psucho, psoo'-kho; a prim. verb; to breathe (voluntarily but gently; thus differing on the one hand from G4154, which denotes prop. a forcible respiration; and on the other from the base of G109, which refers prop. to an inanimate breeze), i.e. (by impl. of reduction of temperature by evaporation) to chill (fig.):--wax cold.

These are the verses that the Greek Words 'hagios' and 'pneuma' was translated into the English words 'HOLY' and 'GHOST'.

HOLY

6944 qodesh ko'-desh from 6942; a sacred place or thing; rarely abstract, sanctity:--consecrated (thing), dedicated (thing), hallowed (thing), holiness, (X most) holy (X day, portion, thing), saint, sanctuary.

6942 qadash kaw-dash' a primitive root; to be (causatively, make, pronounce or observe as) clean (ceremonially or morally):--appoint, bid, consecrate, dedicate, defile, hallow, (be, keep) holy(-er, place), keep, prepare, proclaim, purify, sanctify(-ied one, self), X wholly.

SPIRIT

Genesis 1:2 And the earth was without form and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep. And the SPIRIT of God moved upon the face of the waters.

7307 ruwach roo'-akh from 7306; wind; by resemblance breath, i.e. a sensible (or even violent) exhalation; figuratively, life, anger, unsubstantiality; by extension, a region of the sky; by resemblance spirit, but only of a rational being (including its expression and functions):--air, anger, blast, breath, X cool, courage, mind, X quarter, X side, spirit((-ual)), tempest, X vain, ((whirl-))wind(-y).

7306 ruwach roo'-akh a primitive root; properly, to blow, i.e. breathe; only (literally) to smell or (by implication, perceive (figuratively, to anticipate, enjoy):--accept, smell, X touch, make of quick understanding.
